The IRC's New Roots program in Tucson brings refugees together to share their agricultural skills and connect with their new home through community gardening, nutrition programs and micro-enterprise. We provide them with access to the training, tools and land they need to grow affordable, healthy food for their families and sell their produce for profit via farmers' markets.



What services do we provide?

New Roots Tucson provides garden plots, **agricultural training** and workshops. Our gardeners grow their own **organic & pesticide free** food which enables them to **tackle food insecurities** and **live healthier lifestyles**. New Roots Tucsons' **MicroProducer Academy** provides training for gardeners interested in **agricultural entrepreneurship**. Our MicroProducers are looking to sell locally, please let us know if you have a need for fresh produce and can **sustain the local economy**.



Who do we work with?

85% of our gardeners are women and many have small children. Often finding themselves at home providing childcare and taking care of other family members, these women are less likely to work or earn an income. New Roots provides opportunities for women to work outside the home even while facing language, transportation, or other barriers. Most of our clients come from agrarian lifestyles, the gardens help them find familiarity in a new place. It promotes healthy relationships with other gardeners, encourages active lifestyles, and empowers women to provide food and income for their families
